Rules - Etape du Tour 2005

Art 1: DEFINITION : The VELO MAGAZINE ETAPE DU TOUR is a road cycle race with individual timing taking place on Monday July 11th, 2005 on the itinerary of the 16th stage of the Tour de France, the course of which it shall follow. The race is organised by Amaury Sport Organisation under the aegis of "TDF Sport", organiser of the professional Tour de France. It is on the FFC's calendar of events.

Art 2 : The race is open to licensed and non licensed cyclists and amateur racing cyclists aged at least 18 during the year (born before 01/01/1988). "Competition" licence holders must send in with their application a photocopy of their licence for 2005. Other competitors (FFCT licence holders and non licence holders) must supply the original or a photocopy of a medical certificate stipulating that they are "fit to take part in cycling races" no more than 3 months old on the date of application. Competitors born in 1988, under age at the date of the competition, must also provide parental consent. You are reminded that inspections will be carried out during the race to ensure that the regulations of the race are respected and that riders compete in the race under their own responsibility.

Art 3 : APPLICATIONS: Applications are strictly personal and firm and binding and fees shall not be refunded for any reason whatsoever. Applications can, under no circumstances, be transferred to another person, whatever the reasons. Any person retroceding his bib to a third party will be held responsible in case of an accident arising or provoked by this third party during the competition. The organisation is exempt from all responsibility in case

of an accident arising in this type of situation and reserves the right to definitively exclude the competitor from the VELO MAGAZINE ETAPE DU TOUR. Bib numbers must be fully legible throughout the race.

Art 4: COLLECTING OF BIB NUMBERS :

Bib numbers must be collected at the "Host Village" on Saturday 9th July from 2.00 p.m. to 8 p.m. and on Sunday 10th July from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., upon presentation of your entry confirmation and some form of ID. No bib numbers will be sent by post. Each participant must come to collect his bib number in person. All numbers are definite and binding.

Art 5: SAFETY AT THE RACE:

The race will benefit from special safety measures with police motorcycles, civil motorcycles and protection at all crossroads until the "sag wagons" and two "End of Race" vehicles have passed.

Private vehicles are strictly prohibited from following the race. The Gendarmerie and Police shall provide road safety. Physicians and the Red Cross shall provide medical services. The latter may prevent competitors from continuing the race for medical reasons. Any competitors overtaken by the "End of Race" vehicles at any point on the itinerary shall be excluded and must leave the race. All competitors must wear a hard helmet for the duration of the entire race.

Art 6: The Winning Time system will be used for the timing. All participants shall receive a transponder that will be automatically set off at the starting line and shall serve to

monitor regularity at different points of the itinerary. Any competitors that do not follow the entire itinerary shall not be given a ranking at the finish. The organisers shall collect the chip at the finish. Should any participants drop out or not take part in the race the chip must be returned to the organisers within two weeks of the race. Any participants who do not return their transponder shall be billed 75 Euros and be disqualified from the race.

Art 7: INSURANCE :

CIVIL LIABILITY : The organiser has taken out a civil liability insurance policy in accordance with current legislation. This contract insures against damage caused by members of the organisation and all participants in the race. Hence, should they cause an accident and injure or harm third parties, all damages shall be covered by our insurance company. This insurance covers participants from the starting line to the finishing line.

PHYSICAL INJURY INSURANCE : All participants in l'Etape du Tour Vélo Magazine, whether via their license or their registration in the competition, benefit from Individual Accident insurance set up by the Fédération Française de Cyclisme. This provides cover for physical injuries occurring during "their active participation" in the competition. All competitors may nevertheless increase their insurance cover (amount of compensation and extent of cover) by taking out an additional and similar type of insurance policy (valid during the three days of the competition). All information relative to this (terms of guarantee, capital options, benefits ...) along with the inscription

MATERIAL DAMAGE INSURANCE : The organiser is exempt from all responsibility in case of theft or damage to, or loss of, the participants' personal objects. Our insurance contract does not cover any damage to the competitor's cycle or equipment in the event of a fall or theft. It is therefore up to the participant to take out insurance covering material damages.

Art 8: By participating in the VELO MAGAZINE ETAPE DU TOUR, each competitor expressly and exclusively grants the Organiser and its assigns, the irrevocable right to use his name, likeness, voice and biography, factually or otherwise, in connection with the production, the distribution and the exploitation of the pictures related to the VELO MAGAZINE ETAPE DU TOUR, world-wide, on any and all supports or media, now known or hereafter known, for the entire duration of the protection period currently awarded by legislative or regulatory bodies, court decisions and/ or arbitrages in any country, and currently existing of future international conventions, including eventual prolongations which may be made to this duration.
